Tony Serratore, Building and Finance Committee Chair, reported on topics discussed at the April 17, 2017 Building and Finance Committee meeting held at the Administration Center. Member Serratore shared that at the meeting Bob Hughes gave report on Capital Projects as well as funding for phase one of the 25-year capital plan. Also discussed was the District's energy use, wellness participation numbers and an RFP for PVC gutters inside the Stagg pool. Member Serratore shared that the State of Illinois is not current with its payments to us and at the May meeting, discussion will take place regarding the financial institutions the District will be using next year. A presentation was given at the meeting using new software that allowed the District to project the budget for the

next five years which was very helpful. The program allowed the District to see the impact a property tax freeze would have on the District. John Lavelle is looking at new ways to lower the cost of medication prescriptions. There were four RFP's that were discussed; 2017-18 PE and Aquatic Bid, Stagg Marching Band Uniform. The Banking RFP and Yearbook RFP will be presented at the May Board Meeting. The next meeting is May 16, 2017 which was rescheduled due to Stagg Senior Scholarship night on May 15, 2017.

John Connolly reported on the need to increase the District's bandwidth. First Communication is half the cost of Comcast and will be used in addition to Comcast. This will provide the District with a secondary provider and can be used as a backup if Comcast goes "down" making our network more reliable and more resilient. A motion was made by Member Serratore seconded by Member Gracias that the School Board the School Board Authorize the administration to sign the First Communications Contract in the amount of \$68,850 as presented. Roll call vote: Yea—O'Sullivan, Ryan, Serratore, Dalton, Gracias, Murphy-Peterson and Nogal. Nay—0. Motion passes.

John Connolly shared at the last two Building and Finance meetings discussion took place regarding the District's Wide Area Network Fiber. Mr. Connolly shared that with the LaGrange Road construction, the District in partnership with the Village of Orland Park and District 135, will be installing its own fiber to connect our buildings. Mr. Connolly shared that there are implementation costs involved and the District would then shift from Comcast to our own fiber network. Member Nogal commented that the District is partnering with the Village of Orland Park and District 135 and thus splitting the cost. Mr. Connolly shared that the partnership in conjunction with the LaGrange Road construction is saving the District upwards of two million dollars. The District and the Village are running Fiber through the same conduit, saving on labor costs. Mr. Connolly shared that there is potential for future savings reporting that the District has been awarded a State grant by ISBE and the District will receive an e-rate rebate after the first year. Moraine Valley has contacted the District regarding working collaboratively on this Network Fiber Project. Member Serratore shared the timing of the LaGrange Road construction was important to this project and thanked John Connolly and John Lavelle for all his hard work. A motion was made by Member Dalton and seconded by Member Murphy Peterson that the School Board authorize the administration to sign the Wide Area Network Fiber Contract from

John Lavelle shared that part of our goal setting and having a safe environment, the Building and Finance Committee work toward the District’s short and long term capital maintenance plan. Dr. Gay shared the importance of regular maintenance to the buildings to ensure a safe environment for our students. John Lavelle shared that Bob Hughes worked with the District’s architects to determine the cost to replace various items as they reach the end of their life expectancy. John Lavelle reported that the issue of \$4.5 million of working cash fund bonds (the 2017 Bonds) along with regular operating dollars would be used to address various capital projects within the District. The net effect of expiring debt and the issuing of the 2017 bonds would result in a \$126. reduction to the High School portion of the typical home’s tax bill next year. Member Murphy-Peterson moved and Member Dalton seconded the motion that said resolution as presented and read by title be adopted. After full and complete discussion thereof, the Board President Nogal directed the Secretary, Member Dalton to call the roll for a vote upon the motion to adopt said resolution.
